Taylor will be speaking on the subject of his book as part of the UCR Faculty Lecture Series on Wednesday, September 27, at 1:00 pm in Hill Theater. Featured Resource : Group Study Rooms



The small group study rooms (6 person max.) are available to current UCR students and staff for quiet group discussion and study. The rooms contain a table, a plasma screen, docking stations for laptops, DVD and VCR players and a dry erase board.

Four of the rooms are at the back of the Periodicals Room on the 2nd floor and three rooms are on the 3rd floor in the Library Technology Center.

How Do I ? : Accessing Library Resources Remotely

All current UCR students, faculty and staff may access any of the library online resources remotely. You will need a UCR student/staff ID card which are available at the library's circulation desk. (You will need the barcode on the back of this card as a user-name when logging into the article databases).
